We have had a couple of people from different regions other than the Desert step up and say they would be willing to serve but Article VIII, Section 6 of the LCI Constitution states, "A club member shall be elected or appointed as a region chairperson or zone chairperson only over the region or zone in which his/her club is located." So, although it is greatly appreciated that those individuals have stepped up to volunteer, they cannot serve in a region or zone where they don't reside.

This means the clubs in the Desert Region Zone B need to find individuals within their own clubs who are willing to represent themselves and the district on the cabinet as zone chair. Your sitting Governor, 1st Vice District Governor and 2nd Vice District Governor will continue to seek out and find those who will serve but the clubs need to be cooperating in helping with this effort.

Please contact me right away with the name or names of persons who may be willing to serve as zone chair in Zone B. All of the other region positions have been filled.

One last thing, don't forget to register for the District 4-L5 Convention in Ventura coming up May 19 to 21 at the Four Points Hotel. Incoming officer training for President, Secretary, Treasurer and Membership Chair will be conducted at the Convention on Friday, May 20 from 9:00 am to 11:00 am.

As each of us Lions look forward to breakfast, lunch and dinner here in our own homes, there are more than 400,000 men, women and children still in shelters braving the cold winter weather, not knowing where their next meal will be coming from.

We, as Lions, have been sent an emergency request to help raise funds to assist our neighbors in their time of need. International is sending our Lions in Japan blue colored relief tents to give shelter in the hardest hit areas. Clubs in Japan are doing what they can by distributing food, water and emergency supplies.

Currently LCIF has committed over \$6,000,000 for immediate relief for those affected by this catastrophe. Some of the members have also made donations, and our clubs are organizing pancake breakfasts, two that we know of are Silver Lakes/Helendale and Nuview, to raise funds to support this important effort.

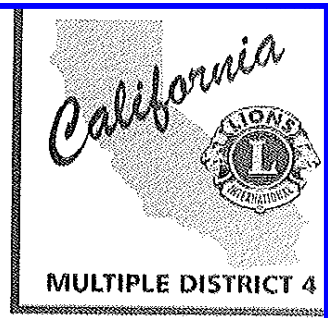

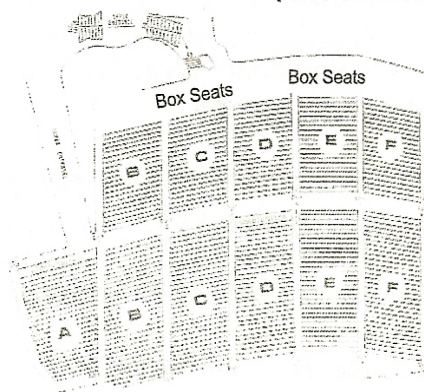
