## Special Election for 2013 Convention Site at Cabinet Meeting October 15, 2011

Each club in the district needs to submit the names of voting delegates to **PDG Hugh Grant** as soon as possible. **PDG Grant is now the Nominations, Elections & Credentials Chair**, not PDG Dr. Al Andrews as is show in the directory. There will be a vote taken at the October 15 Cabinet Meeting in Grand Terrace to decided the site for the 2013 District Convention.

Presentations will be made by at least two sites in the morning of the 15th and then voting will take place later during the meeting. The district needs each club to submit the names of their voting delegates, just as you would for the convention. Clubs also need to submit the names of alternates in case a delegate is not able to attend. Certification will be accomplished when the delegates sign in upon arrival to the District Meeting.

The number of delegates is determined by the number of members on your roster as of September 1, 2010. Article VIII: Elections, Section 1: Delegate Formula parts (a), (b) and (c) and Section 2: Delegate Accreditation parts (a), (b) and (c). Please be prompt in the submitting of your delegates.

**Basically each club is granted one vote for each 10 members who have been a member for one year and one day or major portion thereof (5). All clubs are entitled to at least one vote. The District Governor, Vice District Governors and all PDGs are also entitled to one vote in addition to the delegate count for their respective clubs.**

## 1st Vice District Governor

I just returned from the USA/Canada Forum in Anchorage, AK. This was my fifth one of these forums. Every one of them I have obtained new insight. When attending these forums, new information about how the Lions Club is changing is presented to us. Yes, change is taking place. This is why it is so important to attend any training given by the District or Multiple District. Through this training you will be given up-to-date information.

In my position on the Governor's Team, I oversee the Membership part of the District. In the last membership report received from International (LCI) we had 42 new members. This is good, but the problem still exists; we lost 29 good members. This keeps our District membership at a small gain, the best we have done in a very long time. But, our District Governor team knows that we can achieve more positive membership numbers. District Governor Ken and the team have been working on obtaining five new Lions Clubs in our district for the year 2011-12. This will be done and will help in obtaining new members to get our district back to becoming the best District in the Multiple District. But we also must narrow that rear door and stop the loss of seasoned members. One of the reasons that members leave our Lion Clubs is that they are not achieving the reasons for what they have joined the Lions Club in the first place.

We and our Clubs go out and promote the good deeds and the "WE SERVE" motto of our Lions Clubs to our community and new prospective members. They join the Lions Club to help. We must reach out and give these new members as well as all members a chance to achieve that reason for which they joined. When we get our members to feel the real reason for Lionism in their heart, they won't leave. This is where the leadership of your Clubs takes hold. Those members who do not volunteer, or are sitting at the rear of the room, must be brought to the middle and ask to volunteer. Appoint a mentor to work with them. They must know that they are there and are needed, or the meetings and the Lions Club becomes a waste of their time and they don't show up. They miss a few meetings and nobody calls them, so they feel that they are not missed, and they disappear. When a member is absent for a couple of meetings in a row, have someone call them and tell them that they are missed. That way they will return.

Each Club that is losing members must look at themselves; take an exit or Club survey to evaluate how the Club is operating and change if needed. We must work at keeping all our members involved and helping our Lion Clubs grow because "WE SERVE".

How long have you been a Lion? 33 Years

**Did you serve in a branch of Military Service?** Yes, US Army. Served in a NATO facility in Fontainebleau, France.

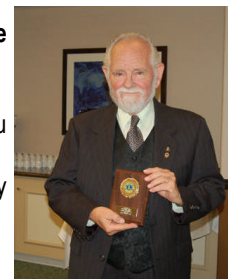
**What are some of your hobbies/likes?** Enjoy visiting National Parks, target shooting, visiting our daughter and grandkids.
